POLICE DEPARTMENT NEWS

With the school year upon us, we would like to remind all drivers of rules as they relate to crosswalks and school zones. Operators of all motor vehicles are required to yield to pedestrians and bicyclists while they are crossing the roadway in a controlled or non-controlled crosswalk. All school zone rules apply within those zones anytime a child is present, a school crossing guard is on the roadway, or while a school crossing guard is removing or placing cones/markers on the roadway. Please give crossing guards plenty of space to safely direct students across roadways.

With the addition of school traffic in our community, fall is a common time for the police department to receive citizen complaints about speeding drivers on our roadways. Please do not hesitate to contact the department with these concerns. Our goal is to keep all drivers and pedestrians safe!

A reminder to all citizens - garbage and recyclables may only be placed on curb lines after 4:00 p.m. the day before pick-up.

The police department has handled numerous "dog at large" cases recently. We would like to remind the public to contact us immediately if your dog is missing, or if a dog is seen wandering. Immediate notification is helpful in locating and returning animals to their owners in an efficient manner.

FORECLOSURES AND UNATTENDED PROPERTIES

Hortonville Water and Sewer Utility would like to be informed of any vacancies so that the water service can be turned off at the street. This will help minimize any property damage in the event any interior piping should freeze and burst.

CURBSIDE PICK-UP

The Village will be picking up leaves and raked yard waste and brush at curbside again this fall.

Leaves and raked yard waste must be placed in paper biodegradable bags and must not weigh more than 50 lbs. Bags will be picked up on:

Mondays: 10/17 10/24 10/31
Tuesdays: 10/18 10/25 11/01

Brush must be 3 inches or less in diameter, cut in lengths of 4 feet or less, and bundled (bundles must not weight more than 50 lbs.). Bundles of brush will be picked up on:

Thursdays: 10/20, 10/27, 11/03

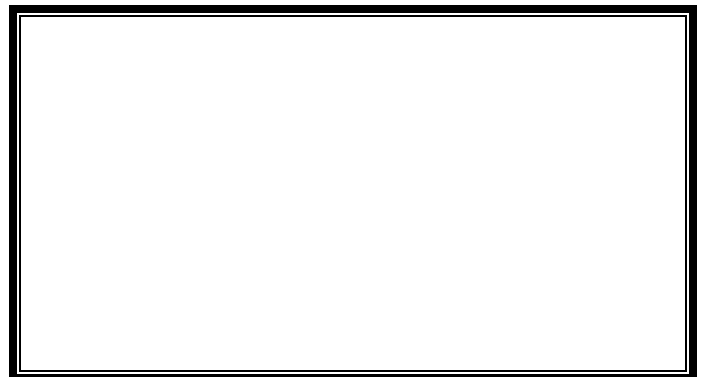
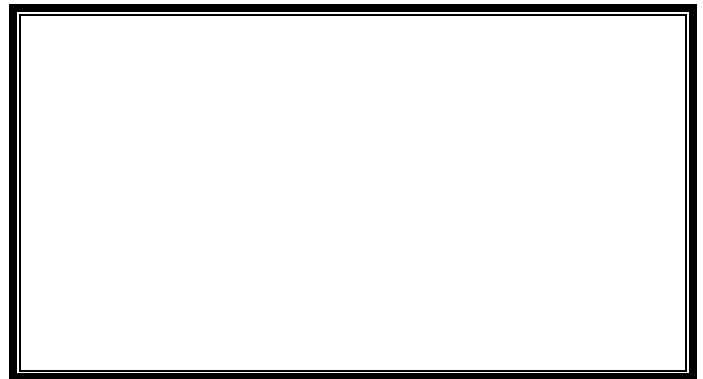
CHAMBER CORNER

GOING AWAY FROM YOUR HOME THIS WINTER?

If you are planning a vacation this winter or will be gone from your home for an extended period (one week or more), you may want to contact the Village office regarding trickling your water to avoid service interruption due to a frozen service lateral. When you are away from your home the water is not moving through the lateral thereby becoming more susceptible to freezing. Follow these easy steps:

1. Leaving your home for a week or more.
2. Call the Village office at 779-6011 (Lisa).
3. If it is determined that you need to trickle (leave a faucet on with the stream being the size of a pencil), we will advise you.
4. Read your water meter.
5. When you come back from vacation, read your meter and call Lisa at the Village office.
6. You will receive a credit for the water and sewer that was trickled.

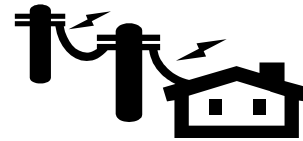
CLEAN SWEEP PROGRAM

D R O P B O X E S

There are two Village drop boxes available for immediate use. Water/sewer utility bills, parking tickets and keys are just some of the items that could be dropped off. WE ENERGIES HORTONVILLE SYSTEM IMPROVEMENT PROJECT PHASES C, D AND E

To improve service and reliability, We Energies will be replacing their overhead wires and some of their power poles. They will also be replacing most of the transformers, both overhead and those on pads in underground areas. In the near future, you will see We Energies employees in the area, taking field notes as they design the project. The construction should start around fall of 2011. Please be assured that they will restore any area of your property disrupted by the construction once the work is complete, as weather permits.

In order for their crews to work safely and efficiently, you may experience interruptions to your electric service while the work is being done. Their construction crews coordinate any necessary outages and will notify you prior to any scheduled power interruptions.

OIL FILTER AND ABSORBENTS

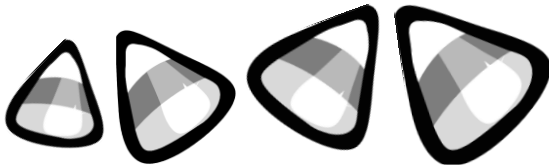

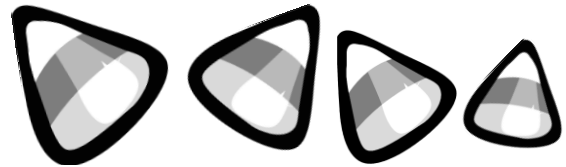
