The observance was launched in 1987 to meet the challenge of then Secretary of Education William J. Since then, thousands of public and school libraries join each fall in a national effort to ensure every child does just that.

Get your card today. Library cards are free and borrowing privileges are granted on the spot. Identification and proof of residency is required and if you are under 18 the signature of a guardian.

We would like to thank the Cousineau Family for this wonderful addition to our library!

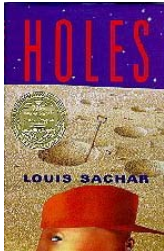


Review Corner

Holes by Louis Sachar

Camp Green Lake is like no other camp. There is no lake - it has been dry for the last 100 years. There are no games, no campfire stories, and no songs. You see, Camp Green Lake is a prison camp - a juvenile detention center - and it is to Camp Green Lake that Stanley Yelnats is sent when he is mistakenly convicted of stealing. There, he must dig a hole five feet long and five feet deep every day, including Saturday and Sunday. But Stanley digs up more than just dirt. He unearths hidden secrets and past mysteries involving many of the characters.



Holes is one of the most captivating and humorous stories I have read. It is full of excitement and adventure. Once you start reading it you won't be able to put it down. This book won the 1999 Newbery Medal Award, the award given by the Association for Library Service to Children, a division of the American Library Association to the author of the most distinguished contribution to American literature for children.

I would recommend this book to anyone age 9 and older.
