

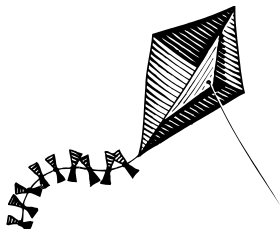


THANK YOU ROGER!

Roger Retzlaff resigned as Village President after twenty years of service to the Village of Hortonville, including 8 years as Trustee and the last twelve years as President. Roger diligently worked to serve the Village by ensuring essential services were provided and by imprinting its mission and vision.

During his tenure as President, Roger guided the Village growth from 2,300 people to over 2,700. Residential households increased from about 850 to over 1,000. Streets, sidewalks, parks, sewerage system, water system and community facilities improved to provide modern services to Village residents and businesses alike. Also during that time, two industrial parks were developed helping provide jobs to the area.

In recognition of his achievements, the Village Board and staff presented him with a resolution, a beautiful clock/plaque, and cake at his last Village Board meeting as President. We all wish Roger luck and happiness in his future endeavors.



HORTONVILLE ADMINISTRATION OFFICE SUMMER HOURS

Starting May 31st and running through September 2nd the Village of Hortonville's Administration Office, located at 118 N. Mill Street, will switch to summer hours. During this Memorial Day to Labor Day period, the **office will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.** Monday through Friday. This switch does not apply to the existing schedules at any of the other Village buildings.

On Mondays and Wednesdays the Building Inspector will continue to be available at the Administration Office from 3:00 to 4:30 pm.

After Labor Day, the Administration Office will switch back to 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. There is a drop box at the Administration Office for water/sewer utility bill payments, parking ticket payments, and key drop for rentals of community facilities.

Did you know that there are several committees made up in part with appointed Village residents? These committees range from the Planning and Zoning Commission to the Veterans Memorial Committee. All committees play an important role in Village operations. A number of residents have, and continue to, serve on various committees. Appointments typically range from one to three years. Electronics Recycling Event

The Village of Hortonville, in coordination with RecycleThatStuff.com, will be hosting a computer and electronics recycling day on Saturday, July 9, 2011 for residents of the Village and the surrounding area. Unwanted computers and electronics will be accepted from 8:00 a.m. to noon at Alonzo Park, 310 E. Main Street, Hortonville. Please contact RecycleThatStuff.com at 920-955-3760 if you will have more than one-half truck load of materials as space will be limited. There will be a fee for some items (see below).

Electronics, while essential within most households and work places, become outdated or obsolete after only a few years. Each computer component contains hazardous materials, such as mercury, lead, and cadmium. If improperly disposed, they can pollute the environment. Resources within the computer and electronics can be used for the future and help protect the environment. All computers and electronics accepted for recycling will be recycled for their base metals, glass, and plastics. All scrap metals will be recycled and reused for future resources.

\$5.00 fee for small copiers and microwaves

\$10.00 fee for CRT computer monitors, dehumidifiers, mini fridges and small air conditioners

\$15.00 fee for large copiers

\$20 to \$50 fee for televisions

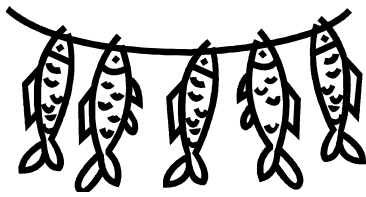

CUTTING NOTICES FOR 2011

For the 2011 grass cutting season, the Village will be mailing **ONLY ONE** certified letter advising you that your grass is too high and needs to be cut.

After the initial certified letter has been mailed from the Administration Office for a specific parcel, **it is the responsibility of the property owner to keep the grass cut the entire grass cutting season.**



Black Otter Lake District

Update on the fish population in Black Otter Lake: There are currently quality bass, northern pike, perch and crappies in the lake. However, the number of large fish is very small and large fish are required as brood stock to sustain and grow the fish population. We ask that people still consider catch and release of all fish except northern pike which we believe are preying on the pan fish.

If you do keep fish we request that you consider the future of fishing on Black Otter Lake and limit your catch to ten (10) fish per person and release those crappies and perch you catch over twelve (12) inches. Cooperation by all will insure a good fishery in the coming years. Thank you!

FLUSHING OF FIRE HYDRANTS

Village employees will be flushing hydrants September 13-15, 2011. The schedule below indicates the days and areas for flushing.

Tuesday, September 13th

All areas NORTH of Main Street, State Highway 15, to the Village limits.

Wednesday, September 14th

All areas SOUTH of Main Street, State Highway 15, to the Village limits.

Thursday, September 15th

All areas that may be incomplete from the previous days.

If you notice employees flushing in your area, DO NOT run your water until they have left the area.

If you notice discolored cold water in your home, DO NOT run any hot water until your cold water is clear.

If you notice discolored hot water, you should flush your water heater. There is a connection for a garden hose on the bottom of most water heaters to clean any build up from the hot water tank.

Flushing ensures the proper operation of all hydrants and also removes any loose scale accumulation from inside the water mains. Slightly discolored water may appear in your home; **this does not mean your water is unsafe to drink.**

If discolored water continues to be a problem, please call the Village office at 779-6011 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

RECYCLE USED ENGINE OIL, FILTERS AND ANTI-FREEZE

Did you know if you recycle just two gallons of used oil it can generate enough electricity to run the average household for almost 24 hours? Oil is a valuable, reusable material. It doesn't wear out - it just gets dirty. Used oil and filters brought to a collection site can be processed and used as an energy source or re-refined for use as a recycled product.

A waste oil filter drum is now placed at the existing waste oil drop off site in Greenville. Area residents and farmers may utilize this drop off site. The drop off is located at:

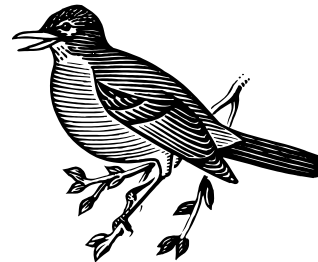

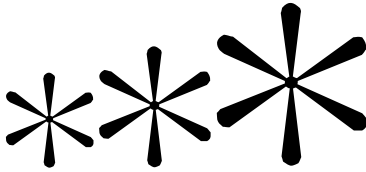

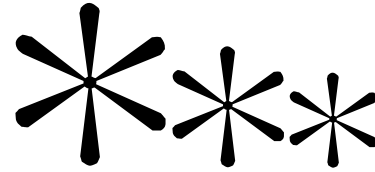
