## FROM OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT

Please remember that snow season parking started on December 01 and goes until April 01 of the following year. What this means is no vehicle except an emergency vehicle can park on any Village street from 3 a.m. to 6 a.m. During a snow emergency no person can park any vehicle at any time on the roadway. If you do experience an emergency or are in a situation that you want to leave a vehicle on the roadway please contact the Hortonville Police Department to get permission.

For the landlords in the Village, the City of Appleton Police Department in conjunction with the Fox Valley Apartment Association, Appleton Housing Authority and Rental Finders are offering landlord training on keeping illegal activity out of rental property. ## FROZEN PIPES

If you are planning a vacation this winter or will be gone from your home for an extended period (one week or more), you need to contact the Village office regarding trickling your water to avoid service interruption due to a frozen service lateral. During the winter of 2009 we experienced major problems with frozen lines due to the extreme cold. When you are away from your home the water is not moving through the lateral thereby becoming more susceptible to freezing. Follow these easy steps:

- Call the Village office at 779-6011 (Lisa).
- If it is determined that you need to trickle (leave a faucet on with the stream being the size of a pencil), we will advise you.
- Read your water meter.
- When you come back from vacation, read your meter and call Lisa at the Village office.
- You will receive a credit for the water and sewer that was trickled.

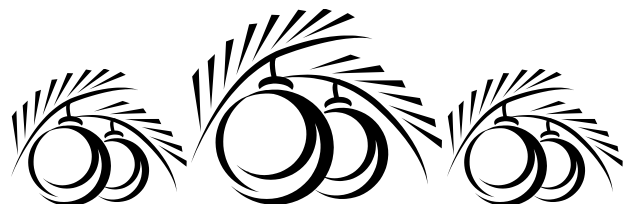
Hortonville Post Office hours of service:

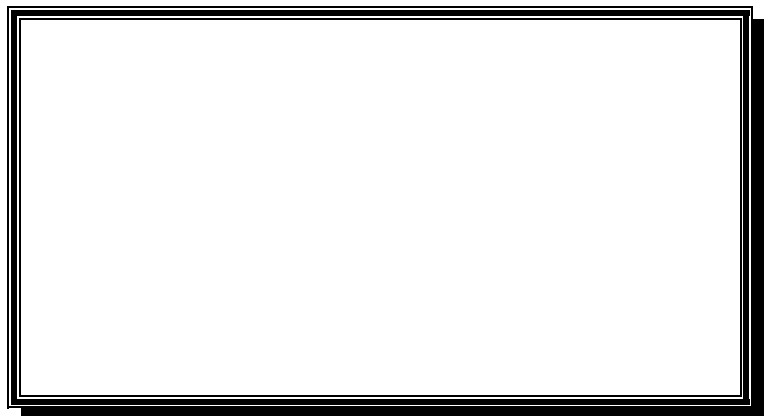
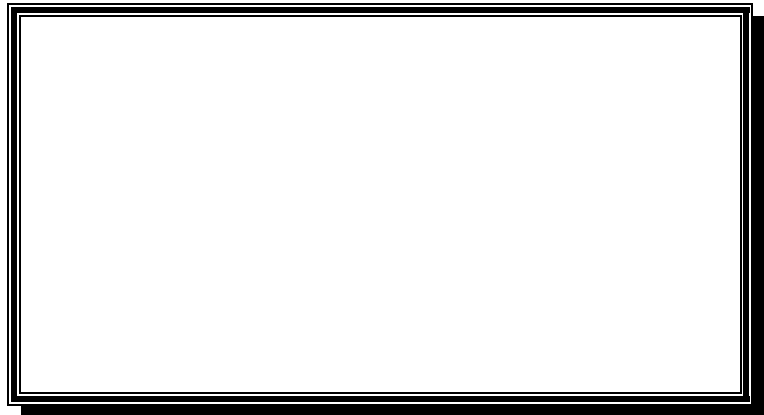
