► Parade At 2:15 p.m.

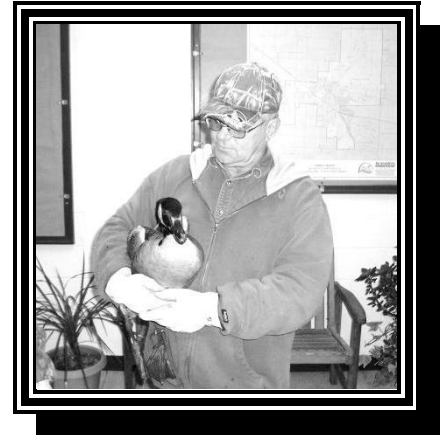

SEWER RATE INCREASE

The Sewer Volume Charge was revised and approved by the Village Board at the July 18, 2013 Village Board Meeting. The revision of the Sewer Volume Charge was necessary for operation of the Water and Sewer Utility without a financial loss. The revised Sewer Volume Charge went into effect August 1, 2013. The revised Sewer Volume Charge is \$11.15 for every thousand gallons of water used. The old Sewer Volume Charge was \$10.48 per thousand. All other rates have not changed.

Billing Example: The sewer volume charges for a residential customer with a 5/8 inch meter using 12,000 gallons of water per quarter will increase from \$125.76 per quarter to \$133.80 per quarter. This is an increase of \$8.04 per quarter (approx. \$2.70 per month).

With the school year upon us, we would like to remind all drivers of rules relating to crosswalks and school zones. Operators of all motor vehicles are required to yield to pedestrians and bicyclists while they are crossing the roadway in a controlled or non-controlled crosswalk. All school zone rules apply within those zones anytime a child is present, a school crossing guard is on the roadway, or while a school crossing guard is removing or placing cones/markers on the roadway. Please give crossing guards plenty of space to safely direct students across roadways.

With the addition of school traffic in our community, fall is a common time for the police department to receive citizen complaints about speeding drivers on our roadways. Please do not hesitate to contact the department with these concerns. Our goal is to keep all drivers and pedestrians safe!

The police department now has a Facebook page. We will use the page to communicate concerns and informational items for citizens. We encourage citizens to use the page to communicate issues that do not require an officer's immediate attention or response. We are hopeful the page will strengthen communication between the community and the police department.

On August 6th the police department held National Night Out, a community-police awareness event, at the Hortonville-Hortonia Fire Department. About 150 citizens attended the event this year. There were numerous demonstrations and activities for adults and children. Everyone in attendance was given a free raffle ticket for 30 different items that were raffled at the conclusion of the event. 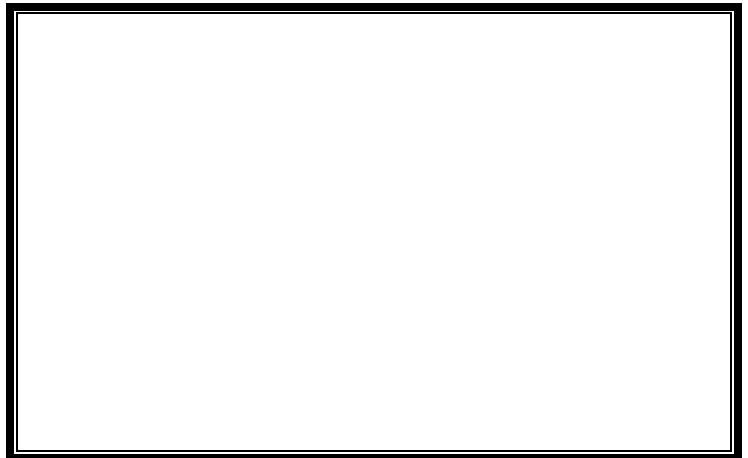
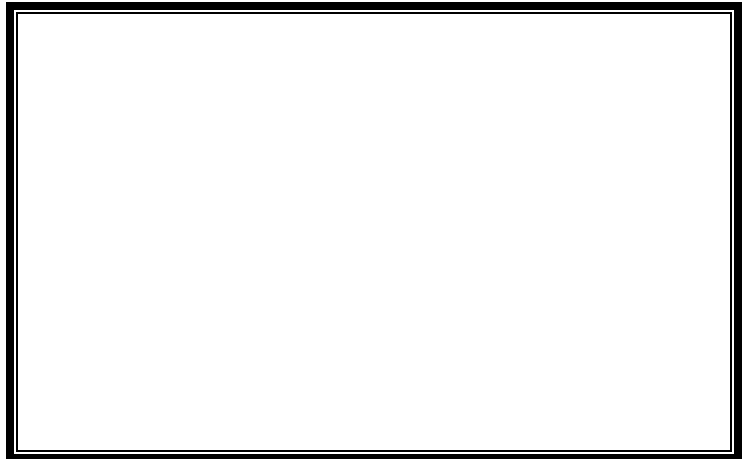
CHAMBER CORNER
