OverDrive Books

Wisconsin's Digital Library is a constantly growing collection of EPUB, PDF, and Kindle compatible eBooks available for downloading through OverDrive. These titles can be checked out for 7 or 14 or 21 days depending on your preference. Books can be returned early and now you can renew a title as long as no one is waiting for it. On your bookshelf, under the Download and Read buttons, it shows when your title is due. With 3 days left, the Renew function (with a circled arrow) appears. If the arrow is green, you are able to renew the item as soon as your checkout expires. If it is grayed out, you can get back on the holds list.

OverDrive ebooks are compatible with most computers, tablets, and mobile devices. Visit the OverDrive Device Resource Center in infosoup for the most up to date listing of supported devices.
