ICE BUILDUP ON SIDEWALKS

Property owners are responsible for the shoveling and deicing of sidewalks bordering their properties within 24 hours of a completed snowfall. If ice cannot be removed, it should be sprinkled with a material that will reduce the risk of slipping and falling. Please note that citations will be issued after 24 hours.

Also, Village ordinance prohibits the plowing or dumping of snow on any public street, alley, public property, or upon the property of another, without the express permission of the property owner.

FIRE HYDRANT ACCESS

Reminder to residents who have a fire hydrant in front of their property. Landscaping or signs shall not be placed within a 3 foot perimeter so as not to impede fire protection personnel. Also, the Village would appreciate resident's efforts in keeping the hydrants cleared of snow during the winter months.

FROZEN PIPES

If you will be gone from your home for an extended period (one week or more), you need to contact the Village office regarding trickling your water to avoid service interruption due to a frozen service lateral. When you are away from your home the water is not moving through the lateral thereby becoming more susceptible to freezing. Follow these easy steps:

- Call the Village office at 779-6011 (Lisa).
- We will determine if you need to trickle (leave a faucet on with the stream being the size of a pencil).
 - Read your water meter.
 - When you come back from vacation, read your meter and call Lisa at the Village office.
 - You will receive a credit for the water and sewer that was trickled.



GROUNDBREAKING FOR NEW MUNICIPAL BUILDING

groundbreaking ceremony was held September 28th for the Village's new municipal The site, now under construction, is located at 531 North Nash Street across from the High School's football field. Village President Andrew Gitter moderated the ceremony thanking the taxpayers for approving the referendum making the combination of Village services in one building possible, acknowledging Village Board Trustees, Department Heads, County Officials, a Federal Representative, and School District Administrator in attendance. Mr. Gitter summarized the 18 month process that started with the Village Board and staff working with Blue Design Group evaluating options for a municipal complex, the February 18th election, the contracting with an architect, the selection of a construction management company, and the request for bids for the various components of the building construction. He pointed out the staked corners where the building will be constructed and announced an approximate completion date of June 1, 2014. County Executive Thomas Nelson gave an address. And, a traditional shovel and hard hat groundbreaking occurred, which included the officials mentioned above.

Municipal Building Construction Update

The site is under construction now. At the time of printing of this newsletter, the earthwork and excavation has been completed, the concrete slab for the building has been laid, the electrical and plumbing through and under the slab in place, and the concrete standards for the light poles poured. Walls started being erected on December 9th. It is easy to see the four major components to the building: Library, Police Department, Administration and Utilities, and Community Center which will also be used for the Village Board Room, Municipal Court Room, and Senior Center. The Village's website has a construction update that will be current and we will report progress in the next Village Voice.
