Welcome Officer Ryan Geenen to the police department. Officer Geenen began employment in April 2014 filling a vacant part-time position. Officer Sean Stephens, employed with the department since 2010, was promoted to full-time in February 2014. Officer Stephens filled the last vacant full-time position.

The department recently purchased a tower light that can be used for events, disasters, crime scenes, and by other departments in the Village for fire scenes, water main breaks, and power outages. The light is available to other municipalities in our area for similar situations. Currently, no other municipalities in our area have tower lights. The light is rated to cover a 7 acre area, and is equipped with a 6000 watt diesel generator. The light was purchased with funds from the Wisconsin Disaster Fund that were awarded to the Village after last year's tornado.

Please remember to keep vehicles, residences, and buildings secured. With the warmer weather there is more criminal activity occurring outside and during the overnight hours. By simply locking and securing your items you can prevent crimes on your property.

Officer Sweeney and Officer Bruette held the annual bike rodeo in the Hortonville Elementary School parking lot for Chocolate Fest. The event provides the department with an opportunity to educate parents and children about the safety aspects of riding a bicycle on the public streets. ### SWIMMING POOL FILLING CREDIT

Upon request by a water and sewer utility customer, a seasonal sewer credit based on the number of gallons above two thousand (2,000) gallons will be issued for a residential customer swimming pool.

The customer must notify the Village of Hortonville Administration Office with the size and dimensions of the pool or a before and after meter reading to receive the seasonal credit.



Fox West Chamber of Commerce


Happy Summer! Greetings from your Fox West Chamber of Commerce! We recently welcomed our 175<sup>th</sup> member and continue to grow.
