

SPRING CLEANING OR MOVING?

Sometimes all of your garbage may not fit in your Harter's garbage cart. One of your options is to call Harter's at 888-804-8556 before the regular pickup day to arrange to have the extra bags picked up along with the garbage in your Harter's cart.

You can also call Harter's to arrange for a special pickup of some electronics or larger items such as furniture or appliances.



VILLAGE RESIDENTS ONLY - This program is for residential use only - NO BUSINESSES. Tires that are 18" or less will be accepted (rims are okay). The limit is four (4) tires per household. Please drop tires off at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, 521 W. Cedar Street. There will be a designated area at the treatment plant for drop-off between 7:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.



NOW is a great time to build in Hortonville!

The Village Board will be passing a resolution continuing the reduced building permit fees for residential construction through the year 2021.

Single-Family: \$749 plus \$250 builder's escrow fee Two-Family: \$1,065 plus \$250 builder's escrow fee 4-family: \$2,418 plus \$300 builder's escrow fee 8-family: \$3,418 plus \$300 builder's escrow fee 12-family: \$4,418 plus \$300 builder's escrow fee

Permit fees include municipal water and sewer connections.

The builder's escrow fee is fully refundable when no extra inspections are required.



Do not mow grass into the street!

When you are mowing or mulching grass, or blowing or raking up leaves, please keep them out of the street. Grass clippings and leaves flow down the gutter during a rain and eventually plug catch basins.

You may receive a fine if you are found to have blown grass or leaves into the street.

Appointments are required - call 920-832-5277




Senior Activities

POLICE DEPARTMENT

We have noticed a significant increase in fraudulent/scam phone calls made to our residents. Never provide personal information over the phone to unknown callers. The IRS, financial institutions, or law enforcement agencies would not request personal bank information, social security information, or make requests to have money wired. If you receive a suspicious phone call note the date, time, and telephone number of the caller and contact the police department. The police department can assist in determining if the phone call is a scam.

With the summer months upon us and students out of school, we would like to remind motorists to be extra cautious for pedestrians and bicyclists. Wisconsin law requires all motorists to yield to all pedestrians and bicyclists in all circumstances.

We would like to remind citizens to keep vehicles, residences, and buildings secured. With the warmer weather we have more criminal activity occurring outside and during the overnight hours. By simply locking and securing your items you can prevent crimes on your property.

Each attendee can enjoy a free meal and refreshments. There will be numerous demonstrations and activities for adults and children. Our country has seen a sharp rise in heroin use and Hortonville is no exception. In the past six months we have had two heroin overdoses and there are no signs of this slowing down. Hortonville PD has begun the process for our officers to start carrying Narcan. Narcan is a medication that can reverse the effects of an overdose of heroin if given soon enough.

Hortonville Police have received complaints of needles found in ditches, parks, and cemeteries within the Village. There are a few ways to keep yourself and your family safe from accidental needle pokes:

- 1. If you find a needle don't pick it up, call law enforcement for disposal.
- Be cautious of young children and concealed areas they may be playing in.
- 3. Pay close attention to your dogs, especially ones that like to bring the owners "gifts" they find.
- 4. Never push or stomp down garbage in an outside garbage
- 5. Report any suspicious person/vehicle located in public areas that are difficult to see from the roadway.



SWIMMING POOL FILLING CREDIT

Upon request by a water and sewer utility customer, a seasonal sewer credit based on the number of gallons above two thousand (2,000) gallons will be issued for a residential customer swimming pool.

Please notify the Village of Hortonville Administration Office to receive the seasonal credit.



OPTIONS - PAYING WATER BILLS

A few water/sewer customers have asked about paying their bill monthly instead of quarterly (water bill comes out quarterly – 4 bills/year).

You CAN pay monthly...actually you can pay any amount towards your water bill at any time. You don't need to wait to get your quarterly water bill in the mail to make a payment.

We Need More Poll Workers


Elections are an important way for the citizens of the Village to voice their opinions and decide who guides the future of the schools, village, county, state, and the country.
